6.0 <u>Shady Creek Outdoor School and Shady Creek Outdoor Education Foundation</u> <u>Presentation</u>

Whereas, the governing board of Sutter County Superintendent of Schools, in order to comply with the requirements of *Education Code* Section 60119 held a public hearing on September 11, 2019, at 5:30 p.m., which is on or before the eighth week of school (between the first day that students attend school and the end of the eighth week from that day) and which did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

Whereas, the governing board provided at least 10 days notice of the public hearing posted in at least three public places within the county that stated the time, place, and purpose of the hearing, and;

Whereas, information provided at the public hearing and to the governing board at the public meeting detailed the extent to which textbooks and instructional materials were provided to all students, including English learners, in the district/county office of education, and;

Whereas, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each student, including each English learner, has a standards-aligned textbook and/or instructional materials to use in class and to take home, which may include materials in a digital format but shall not include photocopied sheets from only a portion of a textbook or instructional materials copied to address a shortage, and;

Whereas, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" also means that all students who are enrolled in the same course within the Sutter County Superintendent of Schools, have standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials from the same adoption cycle, and;

Whereas, sufficient textbooks and instructional materials were provided to each student, including English learners that are aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks in the following subjects:

EC 48245.

In any district or districts with an average daily attendance of 1,000 or more school children, according to the annual school report of the last preceding school year, no district supervisor of attendance shall be appointed, unless he has been lawfully certificated for the work by the county board of education.

Recommend that Virginia Burns be appointed Supervisor of Attendance for Sutter County Superintendent of Schools as she was trained in all duties of Supervisor of Attendance on August 29 and 30, 2019.

Recommend that Jennifer Cates and Brian Brown be certified as District Supervisors of Attendance for Yuba City Unified School District as they were trained in all the duties of Supervisors of Attendance at the California Department of Education on August 16, 2019.



State of California

EDUCATION CODE

Section 48240

48240. (a) The governing board of each school district and each county superintendent of schools shall appoint a supervisor of attendance and any assistant supervisors of attendance as may be necessary to supervise the attendance of pupils in the school district or county. The governing board of the school district or county superintendent of schools shall prescribe the duties of the supervisor of attendance and assistant supervisors of attendance to include, among other duties that may be required, those specific duties related to compulsory full-time education, truancy, work permits, compulsory continuation education, and opportunity schools, classes, and programs, now required of the attendance supervisors by this chapter and Article 4 (commencing with Section 48450) of Chapter 3 and Article 2 (commencing with Section 48640) of Chapter 4.

(b) It is the intent of the Legislature that in performing his or her duties, the supervisor of attendance promote a culture of attendance and establish a system to accurately track pupil attendance in order to achieve all of the following:

(1) Raise the awareness of school personnel, parents, guardians, caregivers, community partners, and local businesses of the effects of chronic absenteeism and truancy and other challenges associated with poor attendance.

(2) Identify and respond to grade level or pupil subgroup patterns of chronic absenteeism or truancy.

(3) Identify and address factors contributing to chronic absenteeism and habitual truancy, including suspension and expulsion.

(4) Ensure that pupils with attendance problems are identified as early as possible to provide applicable support services and interventions.

(5) Evaluate the effectiveness of strategies implemented to reduce chronic absenteeism rates and truancy rates.

(c) When a pupil with a temporary disability, as defined in Section 48206.3, is receiving individual instruction in the home or a hospital or other residential health facility, the supervisor of attendance shall ensure that absences from the pupil's regular school program are excused until the pupil is able to return to the regular school program.

(d) The supervisor of attendance may provide support services and interventions, which may include, but are not limited to, any or all of the following:

(1) A conference between school personnel, the pupil's parent or guardian, and the pupil.

(2) Promoting cocurricular and extracurricular activities that increase pupil connectedness to school, such as tutoring, mentoring, the arts, service learning, or athletics.

(3) Recognizing pupils who achieve excellent attendance or demonstrate significant improvement in attendance.

(4) Referral to a school nurse, school counselor, school psychologist, school social worker, and other pupil support personnel for case management and counseling.

(5) Collaboration with child welfare services, law enforcement, courts, public health care agencies, or government agencies, or medical, mental health, and oral health care providers to receive necessary services.

(6) Collaborating with school study teams, guidance teams, school attendance review teams, or other intervention-related teams to assess the attendance or behavior problem in partnership with the pupil and his or her parents, guardians, or caregivers.

(7) In schools with significantly higher rates of chronic absenteeism, identify barriers to attendance that may require schoolwide strategies rather than case management.

(8) Referral for a comprehensive psychosocial or psychoeducational assessment, including for purposes of creating an individualized education program for an individual with exceptional needs, as that term is defined in Section 56026, or plan adopted for a qualified handicapped person, as that term is defined in regulations promulgated by the United States Department of Education pursuant to Section 504 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. Sec. 794).

(9) Referral to a school attendance review board established by the county or by a school district pursuant to Section 48321 or to the probation department pursuant to Section 48263.

(10) Referral to a truancy mediation program operated by the county's district attorney or probation officer pursuant to Section 48260.6.

Following is the Sutter County Investment Portfolio report as of July 31, 2019. The schedule includes all shortterm, mid-term and long-term investments held at the conclusion of business on the final day of the month. The Sutter County Treasurer and Tax Collector is given authority over the pooled investment portfolio through Board delegation pursuant to Government Code §27000.1. Investment activities of the pooled treasury are governed by Government Code §53601 as incorporated in the Sutter County Investment Policy. Investment of the county's, school districts' and special district's surplus funds start with the objective of safety of the principle to minimize possibility losses. Following safety is the liquidity objective to provide coverage of day to day operations and to meet contingency as they arise. The final objective is earning a reasonable return or yield on the funds invested. The Sutter County Investment Policy may be found on the Treasurer's webpage at: https://www.suttercounty.org/assets/pdf/ttc/Investment Policy 2019.pdf

As Treasurer and Tax Collector, I certify that this document reflects the government agencies' pooled investments and that all investments are in compliance with the County of Sutter Investment Policy.

The combined cash and investments in the county treasury total \$226,971,822 and will provide sufficient cash flow liquidity to meet estimated pooled treasury expenditures for the next six months.

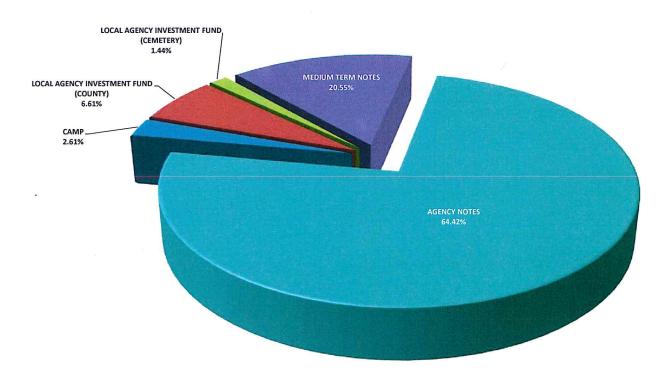
Invested treasury funds total \$216,445,985 with \$23,084,379 under the management of the Local Agency Investment Fund and California Asset Management Program. The Bank of New York, which provides third-party safekeeping services to Sutter County, provides market value data. The dollar-weighted average maturity of invested funds is 702 days.

Investments are selected based on criteria contained in the Sutter County Investment Policy, which emphasizes safety, liquidity, yield and diversification. Therefore, the interest rates will fluctuate, and the types of investments will vary depending upon county needs and market availability on a particular day.

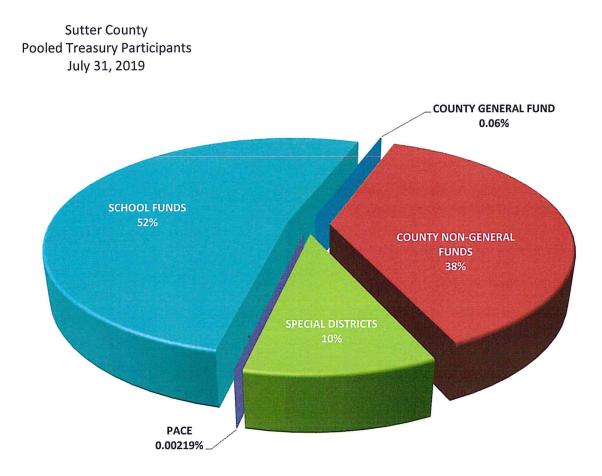

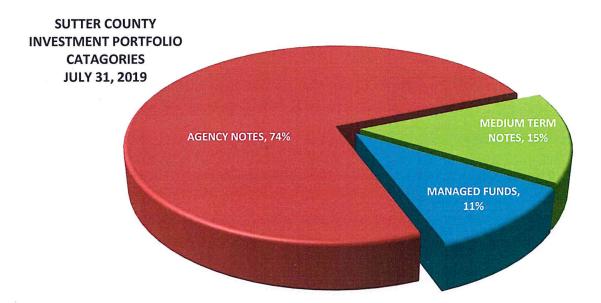
The Pooled Treasury is comprised of 351 separate funds representing the County's General Fund, County Non-General funds, special districts, school districts and funds collected and held for the various PACE programs that are authorized by the City of Yuba City.

At the close of business July 31, 2019 pool participates' cash and investment balances consisted of the following:

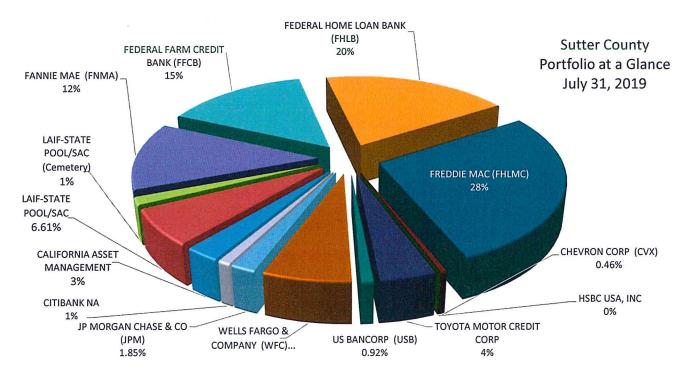

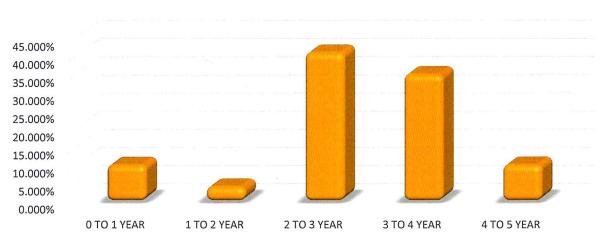

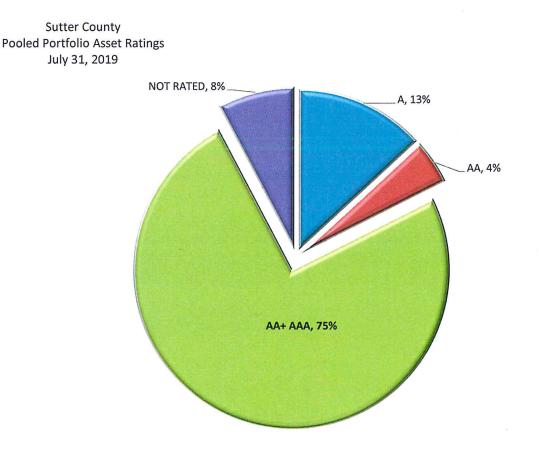

RESOLUTION NO. 19-20-II

RESOLUTION OF THE SUTTER COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION DECLARING SPECIFIED REAL PROPERTY TO BE SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING THE SUPERINTENDENT TO PROCEED WITH DISPOSITION OF THE SURPLUS PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the Sutter County Board of Education ("Board") is the owner of a fee simple interest in the following real property: 950 Tharp Road, #300, Yuba City, CA 95993 [APN 58-050-072], 1699 Sierra Avenue, Yuba City, CA 95993 [APN 58-050-034], and 996 Klamath Lane, Yuba City, CA 95993 [APN 58-050-083] (collectively referred to as the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Property currently houses various administrative departments and other functions ("Operations") of the Sutter County Superintendent of Schools ("Superintendent"); and

WHEREAS, upon the direction of the Superintendent, staff evaluated the facilities needs of the Board and the Superintendent and determined that cost-savings would be achieved by consolidating these Operations on other real property owned by the Board; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 1042, *et seq.* of the Education Code, a county office of education may lease and convey its real property in the name by which the board of education is designated; and

WHEREAS, on September 11, 2019, the Board authorized the Superintendent and staff to commence the surplus property disposition process for the Property; and

WHEREAS, before proceeding with offering the Property for sale, lease with option to purchase, or lease, the Board is required by Government Code section 65402 to notify the local planning commission of the intended disposition and by Government Code Section 54222 *et seq.* to offer the Property to specified public entities; and

WHEREAS, if no public entity expresses an interest in entering into a purchase, lease with option to purchase, or lease of any of the Property within the time required by law, the Board may proceed with the disposition of process of the Property in the manner designated by the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board determines that it is in the best interests of the Board and the Superintendent to sell the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE SUTTER COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. The Board hereby declares the Property surplus to the needs of the Board and the Superintendent.

Section 3. The Board hereby declares its intention to offer the Property for sale, subject to the terms and conditions set forth below.

Section 4. The Board will first notify the Sutter County Planning Commission as required by Government Code section 65402 and offer the Property for sale to specified public entities as required by Government Code section 54222 *et seq.* before accepting proposals or bids for the sale or lease with option to purchase the Property.

Section 5. The Board hereby appoints the Superintendent as the Board's real property negotiator and directs the Superintendent to make the notifications and offers to sell the Property set forth above. If no public agency responds to the offer to sell the Property as described above or the parties are unable to agree to mutually satisfactory terms for the purchase and sale, the Board will authorize the Property to be sold through a competitive bidding process pursuant to terms to be outlined in a future resolution approved by the Board.

Section 6. The Superintendent and staff are further authorized to take all acts necessary to implement this Resolution.

Section 7. All actions heretofore taken by the officers, employees and agents of the Board and/or Superintendent with respect to the matters set forth above are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified.

Section 8. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its date of adoption.
