ARTICLE 13

PERSONAL AND ACADEMIC FREEDOM

A. Unit members shall be entitled to full rights of citizenship and no religious, political

or personal activities, or lack thereof, of any unit member shall be used for purposes

of evaluation, transfer, disciplinary, or dismissal action providing these activities do

not violate any lawful regulation of the Superintendent and/or the state or federal law.

B. A unit member shall have the freedom of speech or use of materials consistent with

the adopted curriculum, IEP requirements or the requirement of his/her assignment,

unless such speech or materials are not relevant to the purpose for which the class or

assignment was created, are not suitable to the maturation level of the children being

taught, or are not necessary for the learning experience.
